Measures to Eliminate International Terrorism

Current Situation

- Acts of terrorism continue unabated worldwide, with increasing ferocity, destabilizing societies and bringing death and destruction to civilian life and property;
- Terrorism undermines the process of seeking political solutions to national or international issues (e.g. the current situation between Israel and Palestine);
- Terrorist groups are largely financed by illicit activities, like producing and trafficking drugs, robbing and extorting communities;
- The UN have already signed numerous resolutions and agreements, without having substantial developments towards solving this issue;
- Several military groups are considered terrorists by some countries, but not by others (e.g. Hamas is seen like a terrorist group by the most part of the member states but not by others, like Iran);
- Some nations do almost nothing to combat terrorist groups in their country, jeopardizing the international security;
- Terrorism destabilizes an entire society, destroying infrastructures, threaten the education, health and judiciary systems;
- Numerous countries sell their arms surplus, directly or indirectly, to terrorist groups, leading to a further amplification of their power.

Solving this issue

- Improve the international cooperation;
- Make a worldwide definition of which groups are responsible for acts of terrorism;
- Defend communities from the illegal activities practiced by terrorists;
- Regulate the national incentive of terrorist groups by either monetary or military means;
- Compose a specific plan of action to reduce the production and traffic of drugs;
- Support specific nations' development in order to eradicate terrorists from their land.
